**Registration fees:** 727,37 € divided into two installments: 1st) 436,43€, till December, 14, 2015; 2nd) 290,94 €, from 1 to 26 February, 2016.

The study of a Specialist Diploma on the subject of Islam, Islamism(s) and Islamophobia is completely justified, specially nowadays where the world is currently witnessing more radical attitudes and points of view and more rooted-stereotypes among groups of people. Consequently, a thorough and deep understanding of the knowledge imparted among the diploma seems to be one of the most appropriate means to achieve the proposed goals, which are: relativize stereotypes, eliminate created fears and fight against Islamophobia through minimizing its effects.
