newsThe Euro-Arab Foundation gives in Granada its course on violent radicalisation

The course, organised by the Euro-Arab Foundation, the Association of the Bodies of the Administration of Penitentiary Institutions (ACAIP), the University of Granada and the Italian Ministry of Justice, brought together 50 participants, including professionals and the university community, at the Euro-Arab headquarters in Granada.

The aim of this course has been to train people enrolled in the main concepts of radicalisation, the tools for its detection, the measures implemented in Europe for its prevention and the design of rehabilitation programmes for people already radicalised. The participants of the course will complement the training in a virtual way through the HERMES [1] platform, a tool launched by the Italian Ministry of Justice that provides interactive materials aimed at all those involved in the fight against radicalization.

The Euro-Arab Foundation will give a second edition of this course next April 11 in Valencia.

This course is also being carried out in other countries of the European Union such as France, Italy, Germany, Czech Republic and Romania, countries that are part of the <u>TRAINING AID</u> [2] consortium.

Some contents of the course

- Preventing radicalisation in Europe: the Spanish model
- Violent radicalization in prisons
- Foreign fighters
- Legal tools for decoupling radical violence in the EU
- Judicial response and cooperation in Europe

TRAINING AID is a research + social action project that aims to standardize the continuous training of professionals who have a direct impact on surveillance and the fight against radicalization.
